CONTEXT

Since FINAS 2024–2025, Murang'a County and GODAN have advanced a territorial approach integrating policy, governance, digital systems, nutrition, enterprise development, youth innovation, and investment readiness. Murang'a is now recognised as an emerging RAFT Agroecology Lighthouse — demonstrating how governance, science, and finance integrate into a coherent territorial transformation pathway.

LESH integration & TRUST-governed Digital Public Infrastructure	Local Economic Systems Hubs link food systems to youth-led value chains & intra-Africa trade; traceability systems reduce transaction costs & strengthen finance flows.
